





## Clinton Nurse Gets Medal

Second Lt. Alice B. Hogan, flight nurse, 22 Williams, Clinton, has been awarded the Air Medal for outstanding work in evacuating wounded in the Mediterranean theater.

Cited for "meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight for professional skill and devotion to duty in evacuating sick and wounded from the combat zone," the lieutenant is a member of one of two medical air evacuation squadrons, components of the wing, who have to date evacuated more than 170,000 patients in that theater.

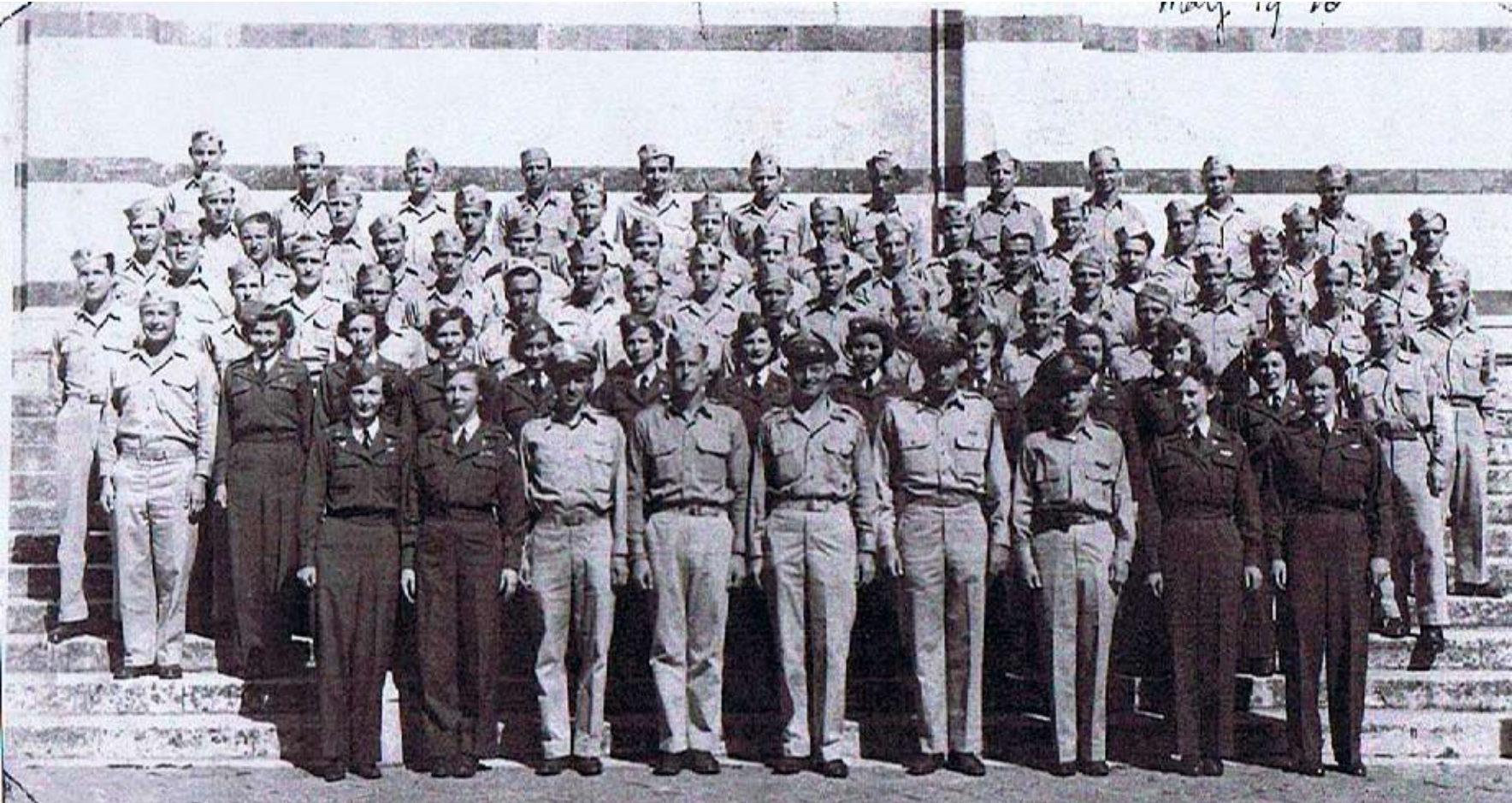
A graduate of Syracuse University and St. Elizabeth Hospital Training School, Flight Nurse Hogan had flown 473 "hospital hours" at the time of the award. She has served in Africa, Sicily, Italy, Corsica and France.
