organization. In 1943 I was a member of
one of the early Air Force classes at
Bowman Field. (Met my husband of 60+
years there) - a member of (Glides class)
On graduation 6 of us were sent to
the Alaska Air Wing (some thought that

Japan would invade via the Aleutian Islands)

Two of us were stationed in Edmonton, Alberta; two in Fairbanks, Alaska; and two in White Horse, Canada. What was our squadron number? I have no recollection. I served in Fairbanks first with St. Lucille Reullinger, and later we were switched to Edmonton. Both places we served only to take out troops that had illnesses/injuries requiring U.S. hospital care. The remainder of the time we spent working in the base hospitals. The only war wounded we saw were a few Canadians hospitalized for convenience in the U.S. Base Hospital in Edmonton. Obviously our service was not as exciting or memorable as that in Europe or in the Pacific. So I have no interest in belonging to a post war organization of nurses - nor do I have interest in the news letters. It is a great service to those interested, and I wish you luck!
