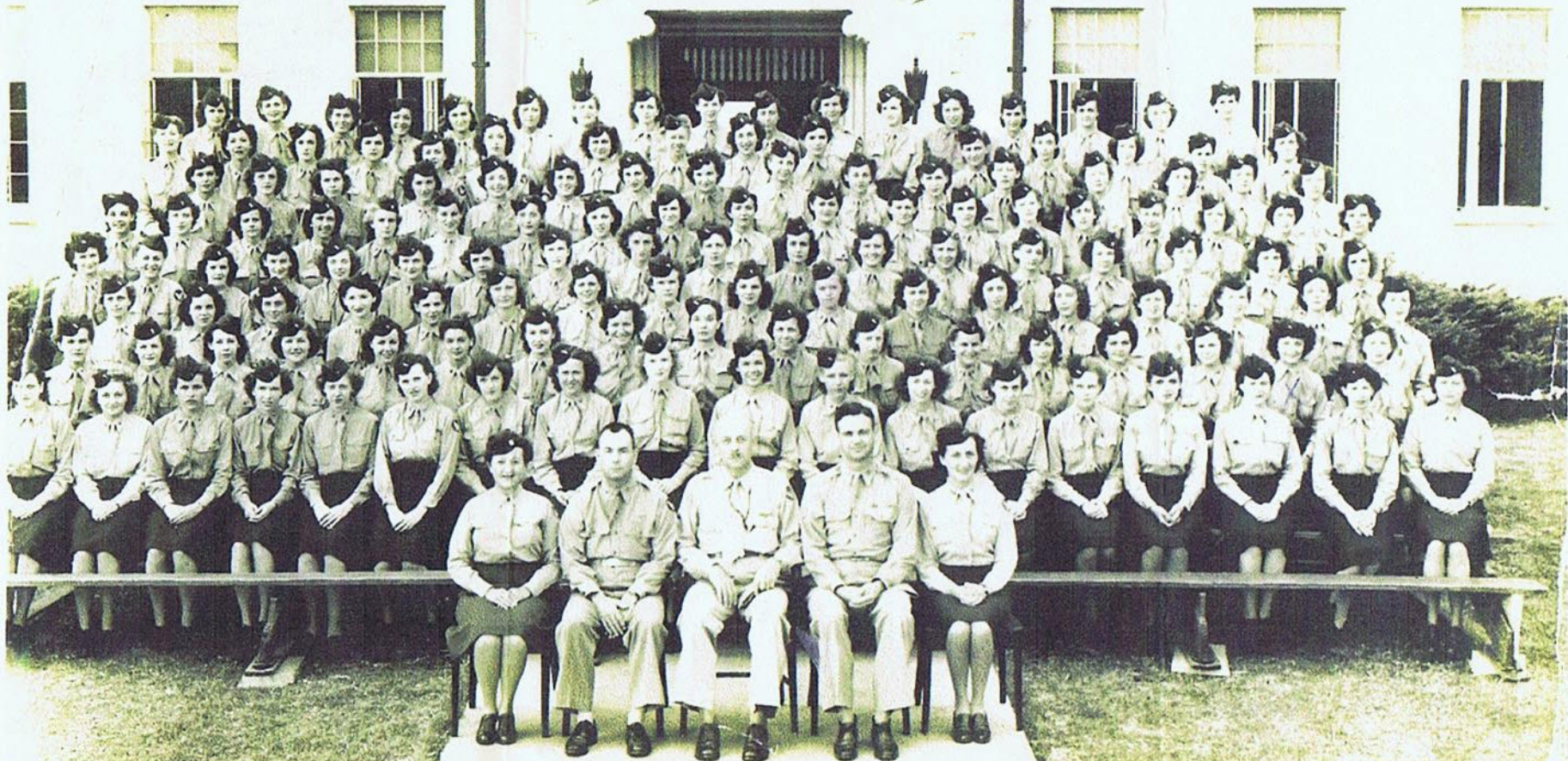

I have some information that I believe relates to a flight nurse listed on your website. The following picture and caption appears on page 78 of the book "C-47/R4D Skytrain Units of the Pacific and CBI" by David Isby 2007:

"Also home from New Guinea, flight nurse 1Lt Frances Armin was part of 41-7732's "back end" crew during it's stateside trip. A veteran with more than 400 hours of "green ink" combat flying in her logbook, Armin had performed many medical evacuation missions from New Guinea. When touring the Douglas plants, she would tell the "Rosie the Riveters" in the audience of the flights their work had made possible.(National Archives).



My interest stems from my geanology hobby, and Frances Armin is part of my "Armin" family tree research. I believe she was born in Washington, 7 Feb, 1915, daughter of Frank and Marie (Ritter) Armin. A google search recently brought up her name and your site.
